Whereas representatives from the Michigan Department of Treasury have requested that any City Council or Board of Trustees interested in exploring Court Consolidation pass a Resolution indicating such; now, therefore be it

Leisure Services staff is requesting approval to extend a 3-year service contract for Roofing Technologies Associate, LTD. Staff has been very happy with their services within the last 3 years and wish to extend their service contract. A final contract will be executed following Canton Township Legal Counsel approval.

BACKGROUND:

In 2017, a Request for Proposal (RFP) was advertised for Roofing Consulting Services (Attachment A.) At that time, staff chose to award a 3-year service contract with an optional 3-year extension to Roofing Technologies Associates, LTD. In April 2020, this contract will have reached expiration. Leisure Services staff and Roofing Technologies Associates, LTD wish to exercise the 3-year extension option of their contract with fees maintaining at the 2017 rate (Attachment B.)

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: As part of the budgeted operating supplies, the Canton Sports Center provides league softballs each night for the umpire to administer each game. In February 2020, an Invitation to Bid (ITB) was advertised for the Purchase of Softballs for the Canton Sports Center (Attachment A.) As a result, we are requesting to award a 3-year contract with Rawlings Sporting Goods to purchase softballs for an amount not to exceed \$15,000.

BACKGROUND: Canton Township purchased the Canton Sports Center in 1999 and runs the Adult softball league program on Sundays thru Fridays.

Canton Sports Center provides softballs for three seasons of adult softball leagues from April thru October. The league schedules include approximately 3,500 games each year with one new 12” ball provided for each game. Rawlings softballs are selected as sanctioned by our national league governing body, the United States Specialty Sports Associations 2020 Official Slow Pitch Rule Book and By-laws. The team registration fees cover the expense for balls used during the season.

In February, an Invitation to Bid was advertised for the Purchase of Softballs for the Canton Sports Center. The following bids were received (Attachment B):

1. Rawlings Sporting Goods - \$36.95 per dozen
2. BSN Sports - \$53.66 per dozen
3. Service Sports, Inc. - \$45.90 per dozen
4. Loyalty Over All Family Ties Enterprise, LLC - \$77.50 per dozen

Rawlings Sporting Goods is the direct manufacturer of the Worth 12” Super Gold Dot Classic M, Yellow ProTac synthetic Cover .40/325 compression softball. Ordering softballs directly from the manufacturer provides Canton the best competitive price available. Mid-level suppliers cannot offer a better price as they order directly from the manufacturer (Rawlings Sporting Goods) as well.

INDIVIDUALS IN ATTENDANCE: None

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Township Clerk, Public Safety, Building and Inspection Services, and Legal Services Division analyzed the existing structure of business and related ordinances under the direction of the Township Board from last year, in an attempt to streamline the process and create uniformity in the application, suspension, revocation, and disapproval of licenses and permits. It is recommended that one process govern all regulated businesses.

Changes to existing ordinances would eliminate the 1,000 foot limitation in the massage ordinance and replace it with Public Safety monitoring and compliance checks. Additionally, it is recommended that we no longer regulate industries which are monitored by more stringent state and federal regulations. As a result, Amusement Devices and Arcades, Service Stations, and used car dealers will no longer be regulated, but will continue to be monitored by compliance checks.
